Finance Committee, Don: Meeting on Feb 11th, Orientation was given by Holly and they looked through the 2022 spending plan and service manual. Organization tactics were discussed. Taking workshops from one Item under area workshops and moving them to a separate category. Looked at the suggested amendment item (not formal): Idea that we have some discretion on how we spend money over the year. Holly discussed adding an additional item so we would have an either or. Reviewing some issues with last year's budget. Correcting a mismatch. Looking at the current prudent reserve. May or may not be changed.

<u>Grapevine</u>, Jorge: The prayer and meditation book is back in stock and it's free shipping all this month. The AA GV youtube channel posted a new video called AA twelfths step tool's: grapevine and la vina. The 26 anniversary of la vina will take place on July 22-24 in Las Vegas.

Officer Reports:

Registrar, Loren: I believe I'm 98% caught up registering everyone that has contacted me. If you would like a list of Meetings & GSRs, let me know. Lastly if you have a GSR that is asking about their packet, have them email me and I'll contact GSO. If you have any questions if you are registered please contact me. If you would like a list of meetings and GSRs let me know. From personal experience, there doesn't seem to be a problem with Service Manuals and having them in stock.

Treasurer, Holly: I paid our sales tax for 2021, I've submitted our Insurance Renewal Application for this panel, and I am working with our accountant to get our 2021 taxes prepared. We had our first Finance Committee meeting on February 11th. Spending Plan Changes I am looking at our spending categories and recategorizing some of our line items. We have new line items on the 2022 Spending Plan with Spanish translation and ASL Interpretation, and these items need a more specific placement. Lines 8920 and 8930 -Hispanic Women's Workshop and Hispanic Local Forum Liaisons moving out of Miscellaneous to more specific Linguistic Liaison category. Line 8970 NCAC contribution moving out of Miscellaneous to an Accessibilities category. Moving Accounting and Fees into Miscellaneous as a sub category. Contributions We received a total

of \$8152 in group contributions and \$33 in individual contributions for January February so far, and we received \$207 in 7th Tradition contributions at our Winter Assembly in January. Zelle is working well - we save on receipts, envelopes, and postage with online contributions.

Recording Secretary, Emily: If you are a DCM/officer/liaison and did not receive my email this week to send in your report, it means we don't have our email. Please reach out to registrar to get your contact information updated. I'm trying out a new way - Google Form - to receive reports to keep things simple for you, me, and the interpreters.

I am filling in for our Chair to give a CNIA update. CNCA's Chair will also give a report. Register at norcalaa.org - San Jose March 11-13. I attended the Sacramento Central Office PI/CPC meeting in January. I assisted Accents/Acentos Chair Jeff about flyers and layouts.

Chair, Claudio: I attended the District 56 anniversary with Loren and Jenn. We formed the E-Services committee and Finance Committee. I met with the E-Services committee. Officers call was this past Monday.

Alternate Delegate, Matthew: We had a great Winter Assembly. I serve on the e-services committee - we have a large task list for the start of this panel. Had several events this month: Hosted group inventory "Bent Nickle Group" D21, Delta Intergroup PI/CPC meeting, H&I General Meeting, Corrections Correspondence. Hope to see you all at PRAASA on March 5th. Registration online. There will be a DCM school and GSR school-\$15 on zoom. Past trustees of the general service board share their experience and it's such a great event to attend.

Delegate Report, Jenn D: Important Dates For DCMS: how many final conf reports your districts would like. Trying not to create many extra copies. Anonymity protected PDF of reports will be available as well. Need info by Feb 22 from DCMs. Several agenda topic workshops, see website for details. CNIA.org under Events Calendar. Early March: should be receiving translated background info. PRAASA is Mar 4-6 online. Pre conf assembly is April 9-10 in Auburn. The General Service Conference is April 24-30. Post conf assembly is May 21-22 in Placerville. AAWS There is a new digital group handbook. New PSAs are being aired. SMF-209 Safety and AA: Our Common Welfare is being updated for legal and inclusivity reasons. Trustee's Committees 12 items for the conference were redistributed through the Equitable Distribution of Workload (EDW). 2021 contributions saw a record high of \$10,782,983 exceeding \$10M budget. 2022 budget projects a loss of \$1.3M. There will be a call for stories for the Black and African American Pamphlet, Native American Pamphlet, 5th Edition Big Book, and 4th Edition Alcoholicos Anonimos. Grapevine/La Vina Your group can buy gift subscriptions for alcoholics who can't purchase their own with the Carry the Message Project. PRAASA register online through March 5th. Submitted Area highlights, will hear on Friday. Will be speaking at PRAASA, topic "Report and Charter E". 72nd General Service Conference Jenn discussed the difference between "review" "discuss" and "consider" in agenda topics. Drafts of any new

literature are only available to delegates on that committee - groups are still welcome to share their ideas. Other NCCAA needs support. There is a service manual study Thursdays at 7pm. Literature is currently backordered due to supply chain issue. Background info in Spanish will be available early March.

- <u>D11</u>, Maureen: Honor and a privilege to serve. District doing well, meeting in person. New GSRs. Planning a Mock Conference on March 13th. Everyone is invited. Doing well financially and discussing a substantial split. Fellowship is thriving.

Titia/Valarie accept. New motion: table this until the March meeting. 89% in favor, 5% opposed, 5% abstain. **Motion passes.**

Agenda Topics: 1081 pages of background information. GSRs can attend a workshop, can go over background info. Confidential document. Pick 2-3 topics for your group. Jenn is on literature committee, so that is what she has the most input on. Goes over how GSRs give their groups opinions at the mic. Conference is about the future of AA, not the past. Find background info on Delegate's page. Many items are discussion or review topics. Jenn goes over some of the highlights of agenda topics.


