- <u>Alternate Chair</u>, Kendyce: I did a pass-it-on with Claudio. Looking forward to GSR school this afternoon!
- <u>Chair</u>, Claudio: Thanks for everyone's flexibility in moving to Zoom. I've been meeting with new officers to support them in their positions.
- <u>Alternate Delegate</u>, Matthew: I made my first PI presentation to all five Spanish Speaking Districts D53, 54, 55, 56, 57. There were 45 members in attendance. Happy to make presentations for any district, just reach out

Seventh tradition was conducted

Delegate Report: Jenn D. Jenn gave an overview/history of the AA conference process. She talked about why we need a conference, our upside down triangle, and the importance of remaining flexible and teachable. Agenda Topics Workshops - Hoping to do joint workshops, weekends of 2/26 and 3/12 (hopefully Fresno, Stockton/Modesto, Sacramento, Chico/Redding). For Linguistic districts the weekend of 3/19 would be ideal. There will also be Zoom workshops. To Share With Your Groups - preliminary agenda is available now on cnia.org. Agenda Topics - there are over 178 suggested agenda items, many will not be included (e.g. new pamphlet requests not considered because many of current being updated/in revision; requests to not move forward with a Plain Language Big Book/5th edition not considered because this passed last year with substantial unanimity). This year will be the first Equitable Distribution of Workload to spread work over other committees at the conference. 5th edition big book - the stories will be updated, we haven't started collecting new stories yet. There will be a progress report on the 4th edition of Alcohólicos Anónimos. Jenn explained the purpose of a plain language big book. Progress on a plain language big book will be reviewed - six plain language interpreter-writer candidates were selected and will be submitted work samples for hire. Literature committee will look at progress on a number of pamphlets - you won't be able to see drafts but thoughts on what should be changed is valuable. AAWS Highlights - Archives is working on digitizing Bill W's personal correspondence / expanding the Oral History Kit. There's a new aa.org website. YTD contributions as of 10/31/21 are \$8.4M (84% of 2021 budget). Reserve fund is \$12.8M (8.5 months of GSO/GV expenses). There is a new AA Service Manual. August Board Meeting - A new Corrections Correspondence Service database was launched in Sept to improve the process of matching persons in custody with outside members. There's a new GV Podcast launched in October. Other Announcements - Consider participating in the

Carry the Message Project (aagrapevine.org). Don't forget about the Meeting Guide app, that you can follow GV/La Vina on Instagram, or that you can get sign up with the GV for a quote of the day. PRAASA will be on Zoom March 4-6 - check the CNIA delegate's page if you're interested in speaking or moderating panels, or being a reader.

DCM Reports:

- <u>D9</u>: no report
- <u>D11</u>, Maureen: Financials are stable. We had a fall festival/unity day that went well. We still have positions to fill.

- D22, Peter: We span El Dorado Hills, Cameron Park, Placerville, Somerset. Post Conf assembly will be hosted in our area. Financials are good. We just formed a web committee to update our website. Roundtables were held (DCMs, GSRs, Registrars, BTG, PI/CPC Grapevine/La Vina). Day 1 concluded at 8pm. Day 2 was called to order at 9am, and started with roundtable report backs.

Panel 2: Conference agenda items - Literature Committee. Panelists included Paul L ("Consider request to revise the pamphlet "Do You Think You Are Different?" to include stories reflecting greater diversity), Lorri A (Consider request to add a historical disclaimer to the front of the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions), Marin (Consider request to include a G.S.R. preamble in the pamphlet "G.S.R.: Your Group's Link to A.A. as a Whole."), Raechyl L (Questions and Answers on Sponsorship - consider request to include sharing on service sponsorship)

- Great to meet all the new officers and appointed chairs
- Remote communities (no internet or cell service) and natural disasters that result in internet loss are something we really need to consider when we talk about accessibility. Last panel was very difficult to live in an area where my internet wasn't strong enough to participate fully


## GSR Preamble


## Area General Service Meetings
