- <u>D56</u>, Jorge: We meet twice a month. Studying traditions/concepts for one of the meetings.
- <u>D57</u>, Elias: Had a PI event in Redding this month. We have a new group in Redding.

Old Business: Spending Plan - Holly reviewed the 2023 proposed spending plan. Discussion - Should we continue to receive 7th tradition at assemblies to help districts with their expenses? Can we change "Assembly Speakers' Expense" to something like "Assembly Facilitator's Expense"? The lodging amount seems low - did we account for some assemblies where you have to stay 2 nights? I don't think we need to have Norcal Access contribution annually. What if we had a fully funded assembly with some of our excess funds - or supporting a DCM to PRAASA? I'd like to discuss more before eliminated 7th tradition at assemblies. Can we get a color copy on the website? I would suggest buying 50 new assisted listening devices (~\$100/each). Keep in mind that the delegate mileage is more expensive because ours isn't in Sacramento right now. Should we consider having a credit card for the area? Funding Archivist to go to NAAAW - our Archivist is currently at the NAAAW and didn't realize they weren't funded to attend. Currently only the Alt Archivist is funded to attend. Dis*cussion* - is this the wisest use of our money if the Alt Archivist won't always become the Archivist? For context, our current Archivist was funded for registra-November 2022

tion last year. The Alt Archivist position was created with an understanding that you would serve as Alt and then rotate to Archivist: the reason the Alt Archivist was funded was because the workshop is in September – if it was the Archivist they wouldn't have gone to a workshop until halfway through the panel. We probably need to look at our area guidelines and provide clarity for what position is funded to go where. The last spending plan says the Archivist will be funded - I would suggest funding both for this year due to the confusion. Loren makes a motion to fund both the archives chair & archives alt-chair to the 2022 archive workshop. Sam seconds that motion. Discussion - 2022 approved spending plan did not show Archivist funded, I misspoke earlier. How much money are we talking about? \$1100. Our current guidelines say that the Archivist should be available to go to the workshop. I don't think it's necessary to fund two people to go, especially if we didn't have it in the spending plan. The minutes may have been written incorrectly but our chair did tell this person they wouldn't be funded. The June 2019 minutes do say only Alt Archivist is funded. Motion passes by substantial unanimity. Minority opinion - I'm confused about what was/wasn't in the minutes because this is happening so quickly; it wasn't in the spending plan; the Archivist was going to go regardless because she knew she wouldn't be funded; this feels against our group conscious that we already took with the spending plan/what we told her. Rachel makes a motion to reconsider and it's seconded by Sam. Motion to reconsider passes by simple majority. The Chair tables the motion due to time to be discussed at the next ACM.

We need a district to host the Pre Conference Assembly. The Alt Chair reviewed the requirements for hosting an assembly. A member suggested a Zoom workshop/sharing session of groups that have hosted an assembly so interested districts can attend.

ACM closed at 4:0 pm with the responsibility declaration.


## GSR Preamble


## Area General Service Meetings
