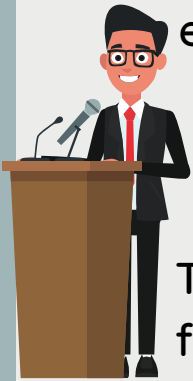

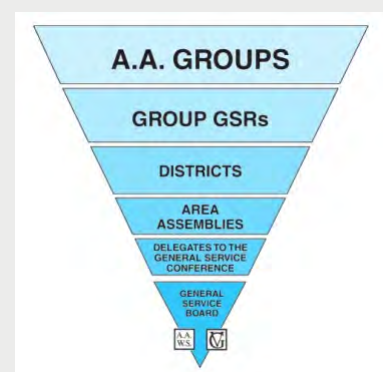
1. Do we try to illustrate a good cross section of A.A. in our message carrying?

Fourth Step Prayer

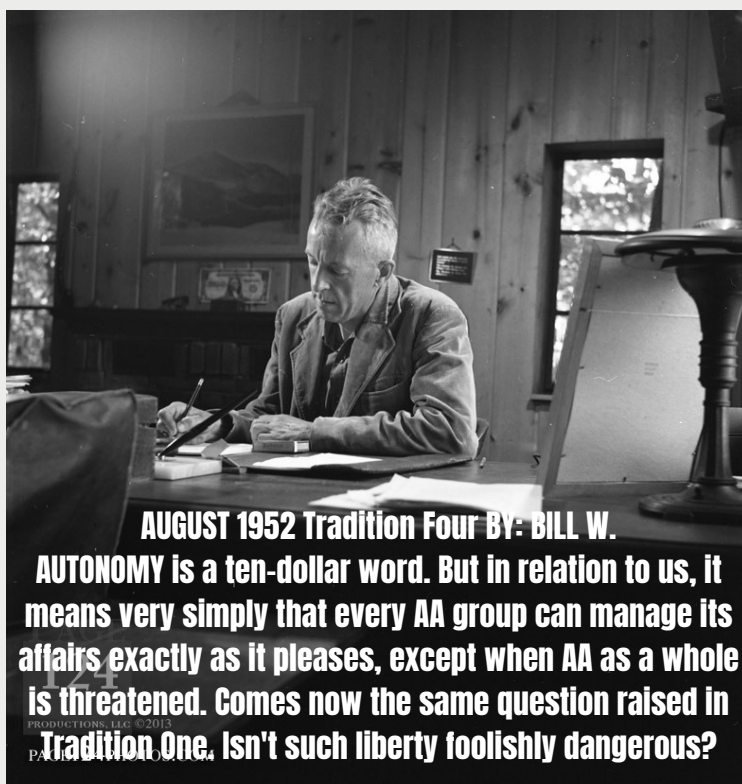
Dear God,

groups ought to be consulted. And
no group, regional committee, or
individual should ever take any
action that might greatly affect
A.A. as a whole without conferring
with the trustees of the General
Service Board. On such issues our
common welfare is paramount."
