# General Service District 15 Area 07

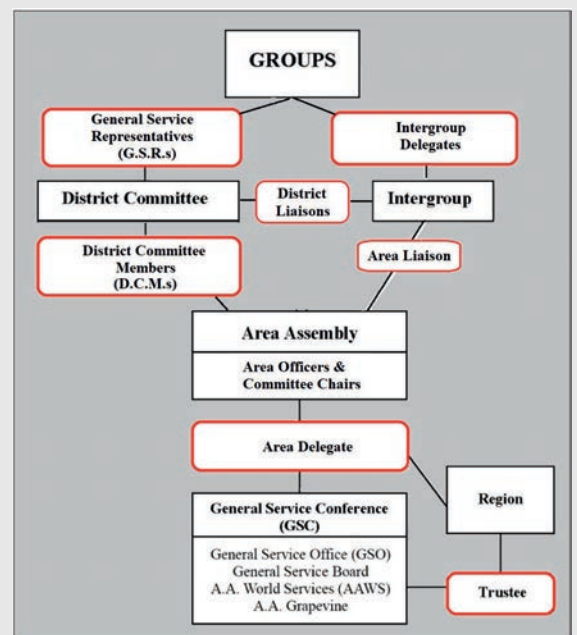
From the Desk of the DCM:

One of the agenda topic items of great interest was whether or not to retire the pamphlet “A Member’s Eye View of Alcoholics Anonymous.” Rest assured the General Service Conference decided to not to retire the pamphlet, yet they did decide to no longer include it as reference material in the CPC kit. (Cooperation with the Professional Community). Our Area Delegate, Jenn D., also reported on the progress of the plain language Big Book. She was able to review the draft of the first nine chapters and noted that the plain language Doctor’s opinion will be side by side with the original text. Also, section titles will be added throughout the text for ease of reading and finding the text. And did you know that the jaywalker is female? Ask your home group’s GSR for additional information! As the draft is not copyrighted, copies of the pages are not available for viewing by AA members.

Although the next area assembly isn’t until November, the work of the District is never ending. This month, I’d like to focus on the Accessibilities Committee. 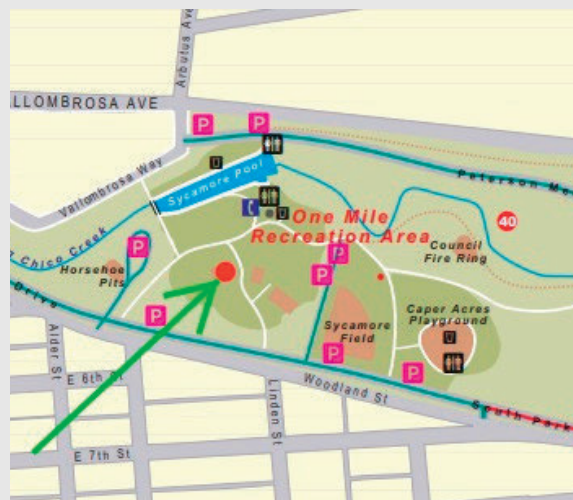

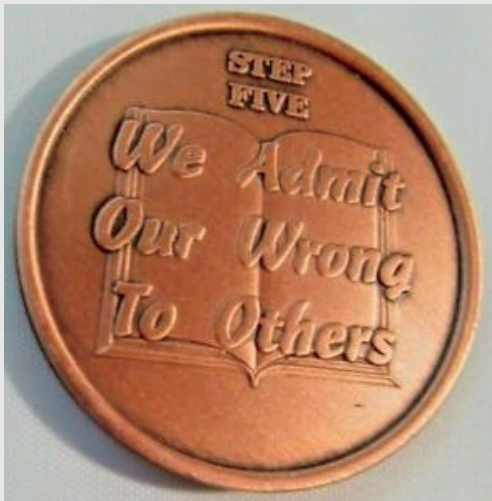

### Tradition Five Long Form:

“Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity having but one primary purpose—that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.”

**Tradition Five: Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.**

1. Do I ever cop out by saying, “I’m not a group, so this or that Tradition doesn’t apply to me”?
2. Am I willing to explain firmly to a newcomer the limitations of AA help, even if he gets mad at me for not giving him a loan?
3. Have I today imposed on any AA member for a special favor or consideration simply because I am a fellow alcoholic?
4. Am I willing to twelfth-step the next newcomer without regard to who or what is in it for me?
5. Do I help my group in every way I can to fulfill our primary purpose?
6. Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer? Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?
